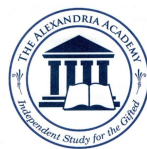
The Alexandria Academy was established in 1998, by Dr. Stacey McEnnan.

It is the mission of the Alexandria Academy to address the needs of children who, for whatever reason, do not respond to or fail to thrive in the existing public or private school environments.

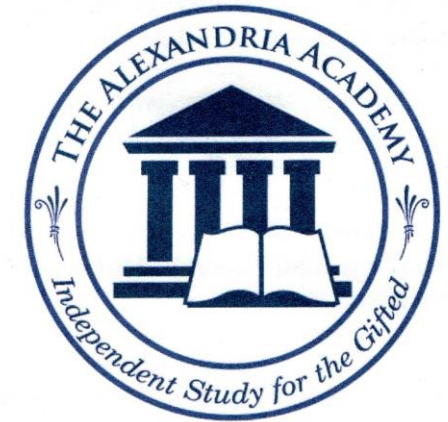

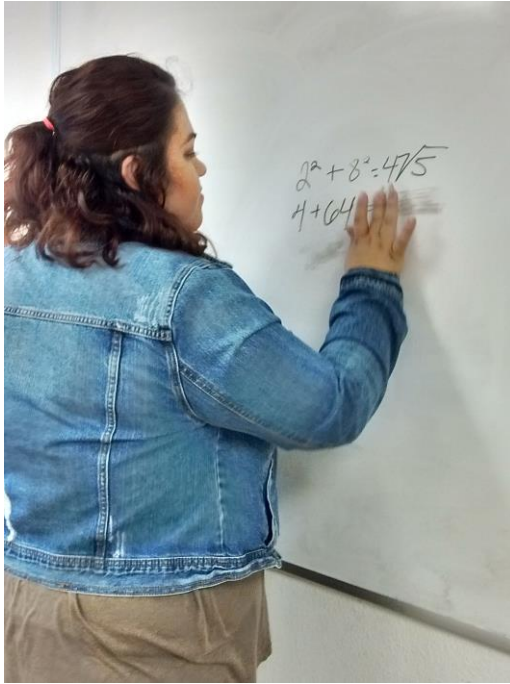

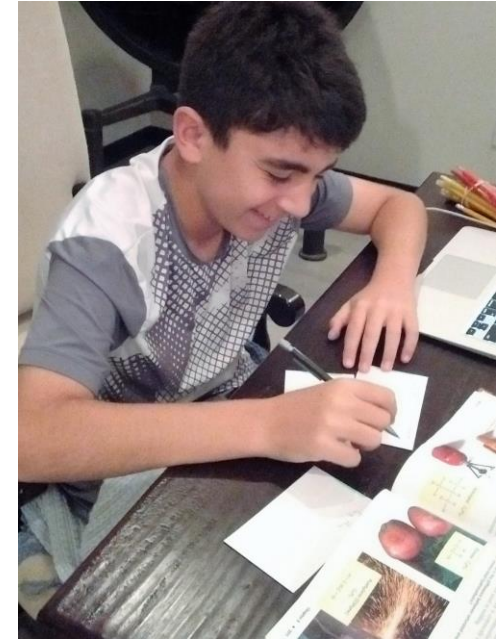

◆ One young student came to us in elementary school with a love of science. We were able to help her advance her studies so that she graduated high school, graduated college and matriculated at UC Riverside in premed at the age of 12.
